It's July and the summer holidays started yesterday. Robin and his dad have planned to go to the Rollercoaster Theme park in Chiptown. It's a big amusement park and they love amusement parks. They arrive there at 9 a.m.

If you want to know what Robin and his dad see and do in the Rollercoaster Theme park, start reading at number 1.


- 1 At 9 o'clock Robin and his dad arrive at the amusement park's car park. They go to the main entrance in the south of the park.
- 2 This stand sells soft toys in every shape and size, but it doesn't sell food.
- 3 At the food stand Robin and his dad eat pretzels. Robin hates merry-go-rounds so he doesn't want to try it. He checks the map. There is a drop tower called Free-Fall only a few steps away on Blue Way. This is where they want to go next.



- (4) This is the small entrance in the north-east. It opens at 10 a.m. They can't enter the amusement park there.
- 5 At the Snake-Rollercoaster Robin and his dad have to wait for 20 minutes. Both of them have a lot of fun so they do it again. Then they check the map. There is an enormous giant wheel right next to the Snake-Rollercoaster. They want to try it.
- 6 This shop sells toy ghosts like soft toys, pillows and ghost keyrings, but it's not a ghost train.
- (7) This is a tower as well, but it's only a viewpoint. People can go there to look over the park.
- 8 Robin and his dad enter the ghost train together. Inside, they see scary monsters, ghosts and mummies. Robin holds his dad's hand and is happy to get out again. He needs a toilet. He checks the map and sees a toilet next to the ghost train on Black Way.
- (9) This is the Snail-Rollercoaster. It's for toddlers, Robin is too tall and too old for this rollercoaster and isn't allowed to enter it.



- 21) This is a very small giant wheel. It's too small for grown-ups and Robin wants to do it with his father. This is not the right giant wheel.
- 22 This is a petting zoo. There are goats and pigs, but no deer.
- 23 After they have been to the toilet they check the map again. There is another ride on Black Way, called "Shipwreck-Fun". They decide to go there.
- 24 This entrance is a small side entrance in the west. It's closed at the moment because it doesn't open until 10 a.m. So they can't enter the amusement park there.
- 25 At the deer-preserve Robin and his dad see deer with amazing antlers, some hinds and fawns. Robin's dad feels good again. He wants to try the next ride... Robin chooses a ghost train. It's on Black Way.
- 26 This bench is not next to the Free-Fall.


If you want to know what Robin and his dad see and do in the Rollercoaster Theme park, start reading at number 1.

- (1) Robin is looking forward to finally arriving at the big car park of the amusement park. It took them 40 minutes to get there. At 9 o'clock they get their backpacks from the boot and go to the main entrance in the south of the park.
- 2 This stand is next to the merry-go-round as well. It sells soft toys in every shape and size, but Robin is hungry and it doesn't sell food.
- 3 At the food stand Robin eats a pretzel with cheese topping and his dad eats one with ham and cheese. Robin hates merry-go-rounds so he doesn't want to try it. He checks the map instead. There is a drop tower called "Free-Fall" only a few steps away on Blue Way. He loves the feeling of a free fall. This is where they want to go next.


- 4) This is a smaller entrance and it is in the north-east of the park. It doesn't open until 10 a.m. Robin and his dad can't enter the amusement park there.
- (5) At the Snake-Rollercoaster Robin and his dad have to wait for 20 minutes, but it is worth it. Robin tries it on his own. The ride is a lot of fun and he wants to do it again. This time his dad joins him. Dad also loves this ride, but he wants to see and do something else as well. They check the map. There i**S** an enormous giant wheel right next to the Snake-Rollercoaster. They want to try it.
- (6) This shop has to do with ghosts because it sells toy ghosts like soft toys, pillows and ghost keyrings. Although these things might be a little scary, it's not a ghost train.
- (7) This is a tower as well, but it's only a viewpoint, not Free-Fall. People can go there to look over the park. Robin and his dad might come back here later.
- 8 Robin and his dad place their wagon in front of the ghost train and enter it. Inside, they see many scary monsters, creepy ghosts and **E**ven some mummies. Robin holds his dad's hand tightly and is happy to get out again. He needs a toilet. He checks the map and sees a toilet next to the ghost train on Black Way.



9 This is the Snail-Rollercoaster. It's for toddlers. Robin is too tall and too old for this one and is not allowed to enter it. And of course, he doesn't want to enter it because he is way too cool for it!

Do you remember what time they got to the park? That's how old Robin is!


- (10) This is a food stand, but it's in the east of the park. It's too far away from the giant wheel where Robin and his dad are. That isn't the one they go to.
- (11) At the enormous giant wheel Robin and his dad don't have to wait for a long time. The ride itself is slow and takes more than 20 **M**inutes. Robin likes it because he can look over the entire park up there. From the giant wheel he spots a food stand next to a merry-go-round in the west of the park. He is hungry and wants to get a pretzel there.
- (12) Drop towers are for grown-ups only. Children under the age of 12 aren't allowed to enter them if they are on their own. Luckily, Robin is in the park with his dad. Robin's dad is not happy about it, but he joins Robin and they enter the tower. The free fall is thrilling. Robin wants to do it again, but his dad starts to feel sick. He needs a break. There is a bench next to Free-Fall.
- (13) This ride is called "Ships and Boats". It is a rlde for small children. Robin and his dad don't try it because they are too tall and too old for it. And too cool!
- 14 This isn't a tower, it is another attraction called "Skyscraper of Horror". It hass cary creatures in it and is for grown-ups only. You don't want to know what is inside!
- (15) They sit down on the bench for a few minutes. Robin gets drinks for him and his dad from their pull-along wagon. His dad asks Robin to find a slow ride to go to next. Robin checks The map. He sees a deer-preserve on Blue Way. His dad likes deer, so they decide to go there next.
- (16) At the main entrance they check the prices: A family ticket costs £45, two single tickets cost £30 for grown-ups and £20 for children. They buy a family ticket and hire a




pull-along wagon for their backpacks, drinks and food. They also receive a map of the park. Robin wants to go to the famous Snake-Rollercoaster on Main Way first.
